They will be storing their energy once they go dormant. Make sure you have a plan once the first freeze comes. Majority of deciduous trees can be placed on the ground and you can use leaves or mulch to protect them. Same with conifers! Tropicals should be protected from freezes, that includes your dwarf jades. You can also water your trees before it freezes, as it will help protect your roots!

A reminder that as the end of the year is nearing, SABS will need new Officers and Board of Directors to take charge next year. We will be voting in November, so think about if you are ready for that role or who you would like to nominate! Let our Nominating Committee, Evelyn, Ester, and Virgie, know if you are interested.
