Hello my Fellow Bonsai Enthusiasts!

I hope this newsletter finds you and yours healthy and happy. As of this writing, (May the 4th be with you) I have been practicing extreme social distancing for 54 days.

I've designed, built and installed a drip irrigation system for my bonsai benches that I can control across the internet from anywhere using my phone. (I'm such a nerdy geek). It's important to note that an irrigation system DOES NOT replace hand watering or make everything automated. Each plant has to be visited, looked over for pests and diseases, pruned and styled on a continuous basis. That being said, afternoon 'cool down' watering can be conducted from inside the air conditioned house.

It's the time of year to be repotting semi-tropical and tropical trees. The repotting techniques, tips, and tricks you've learned previously will serve well for these plants also. After care is always important, direct sunlight and too much water can be harmful to newly repotted trees.

Unfortunately, the May 14th meeting of SABS will be cancelled due to the current City and State COVID-19 regulations Hopefully, June will see us all together again.

MINERAL DEFICIENCY'S

TERRY WARD TOLD US THAT IF THE YELLOW IS ON ALL LEAVES IT'S LACK OF NUTRIENTS. MORE SPECIFICALLY.....

- IF IT IS ON THE EDGES IT IS A LACK OF MAGNESIUM AND POTASSIUM.
- IF IT IS BETWEEN THE VEINS IT'S AN IRON AND MANGA-NESE DEFICIENCY.
- IF IT IS ON OLDER LEAVES IT'S A LOW NITROGEN OR POTASSIUM DEFICIENCY.
- IF IT IS ON YOUNG LEAVES, IT IS LACKING IRON OR MANGANESE.

EPSOM SALTS (MAGNESIUM SULFATE) AND/OR LADYBUG GLITTERING GREENSAND (6% IRON) CAN BE USED TO HELP REPLACE MISSING MINERALS AND BRING SOME COLOR BACK TO THE LEAVES OF YOUR BONSAI.


WITH THE GROWING SEASON WELL UPON US, THIS WILL HELP US KEEP OUR TREES HEALTHY AND STRONG.





Arthur Joura joined the Arboretum staff in April of 1990, and has been the bonsai curator since 1992. He led the design team for the Arboretum's Bonsai Exhibition Garden and has since overseen its continued development. Joura's educational background is in fine art. He studied bonsai with some of the leading bonsai authorities in the US and Japan. He has toured extensively as a lecturer and teacher, and has been featured on UNC-TV. He continues to administer the annual Carolina Bonsai Expo at the Arboretum.

Boon Manakitivipart Awards: Ben Oki International Design Award (1995), JAL and World Bonsai Contest (1999-2004), 1st place Kinbon Japanese Five-Needle Pine Styling Contest (2000), 3rd place Dream Garden in Dallas (2002), Bonsai Professional Certificate (2010), Certré Award, 'The Finest Bonsai and Container Combination' at the 2nd U.S. National Bonsai Exhibition (2010).

Master Nagatoshi was born in the U.S. and raised in Japan where he learned bonsai from his father, Shigeru, who originally started Fuji Bonsai in 1965. Master Nagatoshi went on to receive a B.S. in Ornamental Horticulture and provided bonsai training until he took over Fuji Bonsai for his father.

Master Nagatoshi is the Past President of the California Bonsai Society, and has traveled to many countries including South Africa, Brazil, Australia, Mexico, Canada and Japan to further the art of bonsai. Master Nagatoshi provided bonsai trees displayed in the popular "Karate Kid" series, Karate Kid III.
