After searching for a bonsai teacher, the Smiths began seriously studying with Boon Manakitivipart in 2001 and continue to meet with him several times a year. They're his 1st and 2nd intensive student graduates respectively. They've traveled with him to Japan to study the fantastic *Kokufu* display.

Honors include trees placing in the top 100 in the *World Bonsai Contest*, Best Medium Conifer Display at the *BIB exhibit* in 2003, Best Conifer at the *Lone Star Bonsai Federation* Convention in 2007, "Best Damn Bonsai Award" in Dallas 2008, including client trees.

Howard and Sylvia displayed 7 trees plus a Shohin display at the 1st Annual **National Bonsai Exhibit** in Rochester, New York in 2008, Best in Show in **Fort Worth** 2009 and Best Tree In Show at the **Lone Star Bonsai Federation** Convention in 2010.

Sylvia will be presenting a slide show on the various techniques Howard and her use and have refined over the years when styling junipers.

With time permitting, Sylvia will review club member's trees and provide suggestions. She will spend roughly 1 minute discuss what she would do to a particular tree to advance its styling. With that said, club members are encouraged to bring in 1 or 2 junipers for Sylvia to critique and provide suggestions. Her suggestions will help members with young trees to begin styling them or help members with advanced styled trees bring them to the next level to happily display in the future.

Sylvia's efforts and assistance will be carried to Friday evening, where from 5 pm to 9 pm **eight** members are able to attend a *hands-on/oneon-one workshop with Sylvia*. The eight members who sign up may come at any time during the workshop hours. Remember to bring your tools, wire, turn table, etc. The workshop will be held at Donna's studio *Sculptural Design Atelier* (thanks Donna) at 1514 Broadway, SATX, 78215. Cost of this workshop is \$30. This helps cover the cost of a small meal being provided.

As always, this workshop is open to any members who would like to simply look and listen to the conversations going on. We kindly ask that you donate some money to cover the cost of food. 

FEBRUARY By Richard H

Because of our late winter weather and such good advice in this article...it is printed one more time for our guidance.

February finds the bonsai owner as busy as Santa is in December. There is all too much to do the last minute, yet, planning ahead and organizing can put the hectic, frequently helter-skelter flow of the month's rushing essential bonsai handling into a calmer, more methodic processing of the necessary potting and re-potting which all too often springs upon us unaware as we admire our Winter Jasmine and Forsythia blossoms.

No matter how warm or cold the month is, late or mid-February brings about the swelling of buds on our deciduous trees. It is the increased number of daylight hours rather than the weather which causes this phenomena, although material kept in the house or green house seems to bud out sooner! We burn our lights before daylight and after sunset causing dormant trees to react to our artificial spring. Many times elms kept in shelter all winter will not defoliate, but their foliage usually looks a bit ill with a number of yellow leaves.

There are a number of activities which can help us prepare for the repotting of our numerous budding bonsai.

Pots need to be selected for those trees stuck into the empty near-at-hand container which was convenient rather than aesthetic. We all each have more pots than trees, yet, we never seem to have the container on hand needed for any specific tree. Organize and spruce up the pot collecting before re-potting, and go through catalogs, the paper and on-line, to find the ideal container for that good bonsai planted in an inappropriate pot. I have a number of bonsai of this type. Good trees have not been show due to the embarrassment at the container used. Pots of trees which expired during the winter should be cleaned and soaked in a mix of one cup of bleach to one gallon of water. Let them dry in full sun.

Prepare soil now, mix or buy it ahead of the bud swelling. I usually have Chuck W bring a number of bags of his basic mix as well as a bag or so of akadama to the February meeting. My soil is Chuck's basic mixed three parts to one with medium size particle akadama. We also use this soil blend at our Sunday workshops.

Tools need attention: clean, disinfect and sharpen them before re-potting steals every moment left of the month. What puts a keen edge on kitchen knives will do so for bonsai cutting tools as well. There is a knife sharpening business on South Presa Street which will put a keen edge on bonsai tools for a reasonable charge. (I could never sharpen knives.)

Photograph your bare deciduous trees now. Referring to these photos after the trees are in full leaf will probably circumvent defoliating prior to lopping off branches.

This month also witnesses the presentation of some of the world's best bonsai in the *Kokufu Ten* exhibition in Tokyo. There is a beautiful photo album produced each year. Our SABS library has each of the albums for the last six shows as well as many from years farther back.

Look through one or two to gain inspiration and to gird your bonsai loins for developing your trees into art.

CUT OUT AND SAVE THIS CALENDAR

January: Joey M from Austin Bonsai Society will show us the proper way to **sharpen Bonsai tools**. He demonstrate the proper care we should be taking with the care of our tools.

February: *Pond Cypress Forest Planting*. David Whitaker will lead this class. The following Saturday, February 15th, David Whitaker will lead a workshop at Ryan O 's house. The workshop is limited to 11 people who will be able to purchase 5 trees to be planted in the Forest Style. Cost is \$60.00 per person, trees food and drinks will be provided. Those attending will need to bring a pot 23" x 15" x 2".

April: BYOTN (Bring Your Own Texas Natives) or any other tree you want to repot. We will be repotting and trimming our trees. Bring your tools and soil.

May: *Tips, Tricks, and follow up techniques* on your Texas Natives that we worked on last month.

June: **Tropicals**. Join Jay N and learn the techniques on trimming, leaf and branch refinement, styling tips and tricks.

July: *Auction and club picnic* at Brackenridge park on the 7th or 21st. Real picnic tables—a *real picnic celebration!!*

August: *Tropical repotting*. Bring your own tree, tools, wire and soil.

September: BYOT (Bring in your own Tree) Bring your tree in for styling and wiring .

October: *Visiting Artist 2. Join Peter Tea*, the LSBF visiting artist tonight for a lecture-demo and maybe be lucky enough to walk out with Spectacular tree! The following Friday, there will be a **BYOT** (*Bring in your own Tree*) workshop at Donna's Studio Friday from 5 pm till 9 pm. Space is limited to 10 participants.

November: Preparing your *bonsai for the winter* by Ryan O and *pot swap* to gather pots for repotting in the spring.

December: *Christmas Party*. Please bring some canned food that will be given to the SA Food Bank to help those less fortunate.
